COMMUNITY MEETING TO DISCUSS UNFUNDED FEDERAL MANDATE

Omaha sewer ratepayers responsible for \$1.5 billion price tag.

The last two public meetings scheduled for this fall will be held on Tuesday, October 7th and Thursday, October 23rd to discuss the unfunded federal mandate requiring the city to reduce the sewage overflows into the Missouri River and Papillion Creek during wet weather. The impact of these requirements is both long-term and financially challenging and affects all sewer ratepayers in the metro-area.
